

Reverse Applique

- 1 Draw the shape of the “window” on the wrong side of the facing fabric leaving an inch extra for border.
 - 2 Place facing fabric right sides together on the quilt top fabric and pin down securely.
 - 3 Sew on the drawn line completely around and remove pins.
 - 4 Cut out the window area, $\frac{1}{4}$ inch from seam-- both layers.
 - 5 Clip or snip along the $\frac{1}{4}$ allowance as needed to make a smooth turn.
 - 6 Push facing fabric through the window and flatten seam, (clip or snip more of the seam allowance if needed).
 - 7 Press fabric in place so the facing fabric is not seen from the front.
 - 8 Place applique fabric behind the window to see right side through the window and pin down abundantly.
 - 9 Top stitch $\frac{1}{8}$ inch from edge using matching colored thread, making sure everything stays flat and in place, and removing pins as you go.
 - 10 Trim excess of both facing fabric and applique fabric as needed.
- Repeat for each window needed in your quilt.
