At this time, we can no longer accept scraps, however, we strongly encourage you to make pet beds with your scraps and donate them to HSCO. MMQ Business Meeting – Minutes May 11, 2021, via Zoom

Call the Meeting to Order: Marcia Schonlau called the meeting to order at 10:05 am.

Program: Marcia Schonlau introduced Ann Shaw, who did a class for MMQ in 2013. All questions for Ann should be placed in the chat function to be answered after Ann's presentation. Ann did a wonderful presentation starting with her first quilt to current quilts and how she interprets photos for her quilts and auditions fabrics for her quilt. She talked about the rule of thirds when taking photos to divide a photo into thirds with a grid. She demonstrated "gesture" in photography to determine where seams should go or the use of applique in several photos. An informative presentation by Ann. She told us about the various workshops she offers, including an online workshop. You can visit her website at annshawquilting.com. Plus, her patterns can be found at her Etsy shop. She will be making a presentation to MMQ in June on the freezer template method. She ended the presentation with a trunk show.

Minutes: The minutes of the April 13, 2021 business meeting were provided to the membership in the April newsletter. Marcia asked if there were any corrections. A motion was made by Mindy Wolfman to approve the minutes as written; Eileen Krueger seconded the motion. A vote was taken; it was unanimous. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report: Sandra Henderson is not here. The Treasurer's Report is in the newsletter.

Thinking of You's: There were no thinking of you's.

Membership: We remain at 98.

Programs: The program next month will be Ann Shaw demonstrating her freezer paper template method.

Education: At the Education Meeting on May 25, Deb Ewing will demonstrate her big batch method of half-square triangles. This is a precursor to her flag class. The handout will be on the website. It will either be under Forms & Techniques or under the program for May. She is currently sending out the patterns for those who requested them.

Webmaster: No comments. We have someone who is seriously considering being webmaster for 2022.

Sisters Outdoor Quilt Show: Ruth Kinane stated that the SOQS has not been permitted, but they are feeling positive.

Sunriver Quilt Show: Diny Van Der Velden will be handling volunteers. We will start asking for volunteers in June. The Village has requested that we follow all CDC protocols during the Sunriver Quilt Show.

Mercantile: Gail Newton, Ruth Kinane, Joy Ryan and Diny Van Der Velden sorted and organized the storage unit. They found several items that had not sold at previous mercantiles. There will be a Christmas Bazaar in November in La Pine. A table is \$5. A discussion was held on options for older mercantile items. Dorothy suggested only pulling items from one year for the 50% off table at the mercantile.

Service Projects: Denise Meese is out-of-town for a couple of months. Bonnie has more chemo quilts.

Christmas Luncheon: A contract has not been signed for the Great Hall. A discussion was held on options for the Christmas luncheon. Connie Cleveland said she would talk to Marleen Fugate about sending an email out inquiring about the interest in the luncheon.

Applique: They are meeting at the Community Bible Church on the third Tuesday.

Old Business: There was no old business. **New Business**: There was no new business.

Announcements: Cynthia's Sewing Center is hosting a Sew Steady ruler seminar for domestic machines on May 26.

Mountain Meadow Quilters Minutes – Board Meeting - April 23, 2021 – Via Zoom

Marcia Schonlau called the meeting to order at 10:00 am. Per the Bylaws, a quorum was present.

Board Members in Attendance: Mike Carriger, Nancy Fischer, Sandra Henderson, Ruth Kinane, Sue Schimke, Marcia Schonlau, and Mindy Wolfman

Guests in Attendance: Jeri Banton, Lori Hecker, Bev King, Crys Kyle, Kim Orzell, Bonnie Schaefer, and Betty Vincent

Quilt Show: The purpose of this Board meeting was to discuss the 2021 Sunriver Quilt Show. Marcia Schonlau asked if they had received Nancy Fischer's email. This email outlined the results from the May 17th meeting Bonnie Schaefer and Nancy had with Alpine Entertainment regarding the Sunriver Quilt Show. On May 19th Nancy and Bonnie received an email from Alpine which finalized items with Alpine Entertainment. First, Alpine is discouraging us from having a band to avoid people from congregating. In the past, Alpine would have paid for the morning band and given us sponsorship money for the second band and any other expenses. Alpine will not be paying for the morning band. It has not been determined if there will be any further donations from Alpine for the quilt show. Second, if one of the empty storefronts is available, Alpine will allow us to hold our quilt take-in and pick-up in the store location.

There was further discussion on different areas of the Sunriver Quilt Show:

- Crys Kyle stated that by using one of the empty storefronts this will save MMQ money as we will not have to rent a van to move quilts.
- Mike Carriger stated that the vendor booth fees should cover any expenses incurred. Mike is aware of 6-foot spacing for the vendors. One vendor will have a double booth. Sandra Henderson stated that we have received payment from 4 vendors. There will be more vendor space without the quilt outlet.
- There should be a hand-sanitizing station at the mercantile, volunteer check-in, and potholder station.
- Bonnie Schaefer stated she is concerned about the number of volunteers needed for the quilt show.

Sandra Henderson made the motion to hold the Sunriver Quilt Show on August 7, 2021. Sue Schmike seconded. There was no further discussion. A vote was taken; it was unanimous and the motion was approved.

Lori Hecker asked for a discussion on quilt registration. It was decided to move registration deadline to June 30. She will need to know if Sunriver Brewing will be using the two buildings as quilts cannot be hung there. The form will be posted on the website. Lori asked what email address she can use for forms to be sent to. Lori will use the quilt show address that was set up. When Lori has all the information, Mindy will send out an email blast to the membership. Form that is attached to the quilts will be available to download on the website. Plus, there will be information in the newsletter and on the website.

Marcia Schonlau asked about small quilts in businesses. Bonnie Schaefer has a committee for that. The quilts are hung in June. Our July meeting is too late for quilts to be brought. We will need a location for people to drop them off. This will also be in the email blasts and newsletter.

A lot of information will be going out via email.

Crys Kyle stated that this is her last year as Coordinator of Take-In/Pick-Up. She will write a blurb for the newsletter asking for someone to assist her this year with the idea they will be taking over in 2022.

Lori Hecker asked about who hangs the quilts. Bonnie Schaefer mentioned that she and Nancy Fischer will be in contact with the Fire Chief to see if they would be able to assist this year.

J Bar J boys helped us with setting up the mercantile and Ruth Kinane is looking into getting the same help this year. We gave them SHARC tickets so we will be asking members to donate SHARC tickets. The mercantile will be in the upper grass area.

A discussion was held regarding advertising. Penny Ueeck has the updated posters and bookmarks. They need to be distributed to the local quilt shops.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:35 am.
