APPROVAL OF MINUTES - The Program Minutes were listed on page 6, 7 and 8 of the May Newsletter and were from the 4/11/23 Business Meeting. There were no questions or discussion. Membership approved the minutes.

DRAWINGS were held.


The meeting was adjourned at 3:40 pm.


